Case law consequences and cost comparisons for evidence integrity failures

THE COST OF GETTING IT WRONG

Zubulake v. UBS Warburg (S.D.N.Y. 2004)

Landmark ESI preservation case. Court ordered adverse inference instruction after employer failed to preserve backup tapes. Jury awarded \$29.3 million. Lesson: failure to preserve ESI when litigation is anticipated triggers severe consequences.

Allied Concrete Co. v. Lester (Va. 2012)

Attorney and client sanctioned \$542,000 for spoliation of Facebook evidence. Attorney disbarred for five years. Lesson: spoliation sanctions can be career-ending, not just expensive.

Guarisco v. Boh Bros. Construction (E.D. La. 2009)

Louisiana federal case. Court imposed sanctions for failure to preserve text messages and emails. Lesson: preservation obligations extend to all forms of ESI, including communications.

Victor Stanley v. Creative Pipe (D. Md. 2010)

\$1.1 million in sanctions for intentional spoliation. Court found willful destruction of ESI. Lesson: courts impose severe monetary sanctions proportional to the severity of destruction.

Lorraine v. Markel (D. Md. 2007)

Seminal ruling on digital evidence authentication. Court rejected evidence for failure to properly authenticate under FRE 901. Lesson: even legitimate evidence can be excluded without proper authentication procedures.

THE COST COMPARISON

Risk	Typical Cost
Spoliation sanction (adverse inference)	\$50,000 to \$29+ million
Spoliation sanction (monetary)	\$100,000 to \$1.1+ million
Foundation witness per hearing	\$3,000 to \$5,000
